## Waste and Recycling Service Information

Dear Jefferson Hills Borough Resident,

Your community provides a comprehensive solid waste program designed to encourage recycling and waste reduction, reduce litter in our neighborhoods and ensure that waste is disposed of in an environmentally responsible manner. This guide includes various services that are available to residents. WM pledges to provide the high-quality service residents expect and deserve.

**REGULAR CURBSIDE COLLECTION**: Trash will be collected once every week. Recycling will be collected every other week. Your collection day will remain the same in 2023. Please see the calendar to identify your recycling collection week. Place material at the curb after 6 p.m. on the prior day or before 6 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.

**SERVICE INQUIRES**: Residents should contact WM to report a missed pick up. A representative can be reached at 1-800-866-4460 or through live chat or email at www.wm.com. In the event of inclement weather, visit www.wm.com/alerts for service updates, delays and cancellations.

HOLIDAY SERVICE: Please reference the calendar for observed holidays.





#### **GUIDELINES FOR COLLECTION:**

- Garbage should be properly secured in containers (40 gallons or less) or plastic bags, weighing 50 pounds or less. Place garbage at curbside, in one area, and do not exceed 15 bags/cans and 2 bulk items per week.
- Grass clippings and weeds should be in plastic bags.
- Furniture items, appliances, household goods and disassembled children's swing sets (cut to 4-foot length) will be accepted at curbside.
- Carpet should be rolled and tied in lengths not to exceed 48 inches so that one person can lift.
- Empty paint cans and dried paint are acceptable. Paint can be dried by air drying or soaking up with newspaper or kitty litter. Lids should be left off.

#### **EXCLUDED ITEMS:**

- Building material may be picked up for a fee by contacting WM at 800-866-4460
- Hazardous Household Waste and Electronic Waste (including paint, thinners, cleaners, pesticides/herbicides, etc.) - see At Your Door Special Collection Program
- Automobile parts including wheel rims and tires
- Trees, branches and bushes
- Ashes from furnaces and fireplaces
- Stones and dirt

APPLIANCES CONTAINING REFRIGERANT: WM will collect such items as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water coolers, etc.; however, the item must have a sticker certifying that the refrigerant has been removed. If it does not have the sticker, it will not be picked up. It is unlawful for the contractor to dispose of these items containing refrigerant. When purchasing a new appliance, have the store dispose of the old appliance to save the cost of having the refrigerant removed.

**RECYCLING SERVICE:** Residents will receive every other week curbside recycling collection. Please reference the calendar to identify your service week. Recyclables should be placed loose in containers marked clearly as recycling.

**2023 RECYCLING PROGRAM INFORMATION:** WM is asking your community to help combat recycling contamination. For programs to be successful, all participants must make an effort to practice good recycling habits.

- No plastic bags of any kind will be accepted. Place material loose in your recycling cart.
- Make sure you are only recycling plastic bottles, jugs and jars. Any other plastic shape must go in the trash.
- Glass is no longer accepted for curbside recycling talk to your municipality about local drop off programs.
- Containers that held food should be rinsed free of food debris and liquid.
- Shredded paper is not accepted.

## Home Collection Program for Household Generated Special Materials

As part of the residential solid waste and recycling contract with Waste Management, effective January 1, 2022, you have a convenient new opportunity to dispose of your household generated special materials- safely, easily and responsibly. Introducing the At Your Door Special Collection<sup>SM</sup> program, a residential service offered by Waste Management to provide vear-round collec-tions for you.

### HOW DOES IT WORK?

## 1.To Participate, you must set up a collection appointment.

The Call Center operators will guide you through the steps toward a safe and successful collection. You will be asked several questions, including your address and the type and amount of materials available for the pick up. You will be provided a convenient collection date and information about where to place the kit for collection. A kit will be sent to your home in plenty of time for you to gather and pack your materials.

### 2. Preparing for collection

The collection kit includes an instruction sheet and other items to help pack and secure your household generated special materials. Please read the instruction sheet included in the kit.

#### Material is collected

On the scheduled date, the customer service technician will collect materials directly from your home. They will sort and pack the materials for proper transportation, recycling and disposal. Participants will receive a postage-paid survey card to complete and mail back to help track the program.

### 4. You have more material than will fit into the Kit?

Remember, this service is available year-round. Just schedule another collection! Small quantities may be combined with your neighbors. Managing Household Hazardous Waste: The best method of managing Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) is to prevent its generation in the first place. This involves selecting the least toxic item "to do the job" and buying only the minimum amounts necessary. Buying in large quantities is not a bargain if half of it has to be discarded. In the future, please consider buying environmentally friendly products.

#### Did You Know?

Latex paint is not a hazardous waste. It can often be donated to community groups and other organizations for re-use. Please consider this option before disposal.

Used motor oil is not hazardous, but may pollute our groundwater, waterways and soil if not properly managed. Many automotive station, auto parts and supply stores will accept used motor oil for recycling.

Automotive batteries may be exchanged at the place of purchase. Many battery retailers offer recycling even if you are not purchasing a new battery. In some cases, there may be a charge. Some scrap yards will also purchase lead acid batteries.
