Borough of Jefferson Hills Regular Meeting of Council June 12, 2023

The regular meeting of Council was called to order by President Steffey at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Centers, 925 Old Clairton Road. Council Members Bucy, Vice President Budd, Lynch, Montgomery, Reynolds, Ruscitto, President Steffey, and Mayor McCaffrey answered to roll call. Finance Officer Drager, Solicitor Gabriel, Chief Dziezgowski, Engineer Glister, and Public Works Director Volpe were also present. Borough Manager Stinner and Consulting Engineer Minsterman were absent.

Mrs. Steffey moved agenda item No. 10 to the top of the agenda.

Mrs. Budd moved to present a proclamation to the TJ Boys' Volleyball Team for their fundraisers benefitting McKeesport Officer Charles Thomas, seconded by Mr. Lynch, and carried unanimously.

Mayor McCaffrey read the Proclamation.

Mrs. Ruscitto moved to appoint Dr. Judith Kaufmann to one seat on the Environmental Advisory Council expiring December 31, 2023, seconded by Mrs. Bucy, and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Bucy stated Dr. Judy Kaufmann is one of our Jefferson Hills residents. She is a doctor of epidemiology. She is willing to commit her services to the Environmental Advisory Council for the safety of all the children in the world. She will be a tremendous asset due to the fact of her many medical degrees.

Mr. Montgomery moved to advertise one seat on the Jefferson Hills Borough Police Pension Advisory Committee, seconded by Mrs. Ruscitto, and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Budd moved to adopt Ordinance No. 900 amending Section 616 of Ordinance No. 535, as codified in Chapter 15, Section 15-402 to modify the defined no-parking areas by street, seconded by Mrs. Ruscitto, and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Budd moved to adopt Ordinance No. 901 amending Chapter 19 of the Code of Ordinances, to add Section 19-106 "to require all applicants to file a separate permit application for each proposed temporary sign design, with a separate permit fee and/or separate posting of cash bond, as established from time to time by Borough Council resolution", seconded by Mrs. Bucy, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Lynch left the meeting at 7:11 p.m.

Mr. Montgomery moved to adopt Resolution No. 14-2023 approving the sale of the 2008 Ford F-250 (VIN 1FTSW21548EE40377) for \$5,100.00 and the 2013 Ford Explorer (VIN 1FM5K8AR7DGC35189) for \$5,000.00 to the best responsible bidders through the Perryopolis Auto Sales Auction, seconded by Mrs. Bucy. Mr. Montgomery moved to adopt Resolution No. 18-2023 recognizing South Hills Mothers of Multiples as a civic and/or service association under the Local Options Small Games of Chance Act, seconded by Mrs. Bucy.

Mr. Montgomery asked if any organization needs to do small games of chance, will they have to do this in the Borough?

Mrs. Steffey responded through the Borough, yes.

Mrs. Budd moved to approve a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Jefferson Hills Police Department and the Allegheny Intermediate Unit-Mon Valley School which establishes procedures to be followed when certain incidents occur on school property in accordance with the Safe Schools Act, seconded by Mrs. Ruscitto, and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Bucy moved to perform a formal title search of Lobb's Run Park with the intention to acquire parcels to expand Lobb's Run Park, seconded by Mrs. Ruscitto, and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Budd moved to instruct the Borough Manager, Borough Engineer, Public Works Director, and Borough Planner to investigate and perform a needs assessment on current park playgrounds, seconded by Mrs. Bucy, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Mongomery moved to adopt Resolution No. 15-2023 authorizing Stanley L. Gorski of SHACOG to file the Act 152 Grant application in the amount of \$60,350.00 for the Demolitions at 102 Arch Street, 1412 Worthington Ave, 1420 High Road, and 613 Cochran Mill Road estimated at \$71,000.00 with a Borough share of \$10,650.00, seconded by Mrs. Bucy. Mr. Montgomery moved to approve Application for Payment No. 3 and Final from State Pipe Services, Inc. in the amount of \$13,151.40 for work completed on the Joint Municipal SHACOG O&M

CCTV – Year 12 Project, subject to the receipt of an invoice from SHACOG, seconded by Mrs. Bucy, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Montgomery stated that it was less than expected on the expenditures for that.

Mr. Montgomery moved to approve Application for Payment No. 1 and Final from Robinson Pipe Cleaning Company in the amount of \$14,934.72 for work completed on the Joint Municipal SHACOG Preventative Maintenance – Year 12 Project, subject to the receipt of an invoice from SHACOG, seconded by Mrs. Bucy, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Montgomery stated this was less than budgeted also.

Mrs. Budd moved to approve Quote #88011 from Sportsfield Specialties, Inc. for two (2) tension style batting tunnels, for two (2) overhead style batting tunnels, foundation sleeves, and assembly for Andrew Reilly Memorial Park in the amount of \$53,199.00, seconded by Mrs. Ruscitto. The vote was not unanimous, and a roll call vote was taken per Borough Code, which requires that the minutes show the actual votes by name, below are the votes of each Council Member.

BOROUGH RESIDENT/TAXPAYER COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Mrs. Steffey read a letter from Lori Folino, 5130 Oak Road.

"To Whom It May Concern, I am writing this letter once again to voice my concern regarding the property located at 5126 Oak Road, Jefferson Hills. This is getting to be ridiculous that every year I must contact the Borough regarding this property not being maintained.

Over the past few years, I have filed a complaint with the Borough about this property not being maintained. Now another year has gone by, and the property is not maintained again. As my son and husband have noticed while cutting grass a snake is coming from the property and we have noticed mice as well which we have NEVER had. The property is a breeding ground for ticks and other insects and rodents to live and it is completely wrong. We have problems pulling out of our driveway because the grass is well over 3ft. high. The grass is growing through the fence between our property lines as well.

People's Gas thinks that it is ok to maybe cut this property once or twice a year, well let me tell you that it is not OK!

People's Gas shouldn't be allowed to continue to let this property get out of control. Jefferson Hills has an ordinance to keep property cut and maintained and I feel that because this is a company, our Borough is overlooking this. I have lived in this Borough since 1977 and if my property or any other resident's property looked like that I would be notified and given a fine.

I hope that this matter will be addressed once and for all. As I stated before, there are snakes, mice, and most definitely ticks living in that well over 3 feet high grass. I don't feel like my family should be a prisoner in our own home and not able to sit or play outside with fear of the danger right next door. It would be very sad if an accident happened due to the condition of this property and the Borough did not act against People's Gas especially after being warned year after year."

Mrs. Ruscitto stated Mrs. Folino came to speak with me regarding this situation. She also spoke with Mayor McCaffrey. We certainly agree about pursuing this issue for her. I agree with Mrs. Folino that because it is a company, that should not distinguish or make them any different from anybody else within the Borough. Hopefully, after discussions with Mr. Seskey and Mr. Reis, we can move forward and help the Folinos out.

Mr. Reynolds asked are they going there tomorrow? It should be that important. It should be prioritized.

Mrs. Ruscitto responded they have already been there and gave the gas company a notification. But there is a process. Sadly, it takes a long time.

Mr. Reynolds asked in the meantime, can we send public works out to cut the grass and send Peoples the bill?

Mrs. Ruscitto stated I do not know about that legally.

Mrs. Steffey stated that is going to have to be a decision for Mr. Reis.

Mr. Drager stated We have maintained properties in the past. It is typically delinquent properties where we have cleaned it up and then billed them.

Solicitor Gabriel stated it is possible to do a municipal lien on this situation.

Mrs. Steffey stated we will contact Mrs. Folino tomorrow after we speak to Mr. Reis.

Mrs. Steffey read a letter from Mariah Provins, Sean Cooper, and Geri Prinkey.

"Jefferson Hills Council, thank you so much for all that you have done to build and unveil the memorial. It means so much to us that so many people have come together to honor my Dad's memory.
